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**B**ill Shewchuk was born in Pensacola, Florida. His Dad was in the Navy so the family of six kids moved every two or three years and Bill grew up traveling the United States from Pensacola and Corpus Cristi, Florida to San Diego, California. When he was 10 years old they lived in Monterey for a year while his Dad was a student at NPS. Bill



remembers swimming in what is now the reflecting pool there. The family moved to Lemoore, California and then on to Norfolk, Virginia. Bill attended

high school in Jacksonville, Florida and Virginia Beach, VA. He went to Jacksonville University through the NROTC program. In 1977 he graduated with a B.S. in Political Science and was commissioned an Ensign in the U.S. Navy. Bill also has a Masters in Political Science from Auburn University in Alabama, a Masters in Public Administration from the Harvard Kennedy School of Government

in Massachusetts, and a Masters in Executive Management from NPS. Bill really enjoys education and describes himself as a lifelong learner.

In the Navy, Bill was an attack pilot, flying the A-6 Intruder off aircraft carriers. He has 680 carrier arrested landings, or "traps," and more than 200 of them at night! He told a story about being a naval flight instructor in Pensacola and showing a video from the cockpit of an Intruder on the flight deck at night. Explaining that really all you can see are the light wands, not the people holding them and directing you, a student exclaimed, "This is what I signed up for?!!" Bill never saw combat, for which his wife, Donna, is grateful, but he expressed some wistfulness at not participating in something for which he had trained.

**B**ill and Donna met at college, married a week after graduation, and a week after that Bill was flight training in Pensacola. Throughout his Navy career, Bill and Donna moved regularly around the county and even to Gaeta, Italy, for two years. They moved to Monterey in 2005 after his assignment officer offered several suggestions about where Bill could go for his last active duty Navy assignment. When Monterey and NPS came up, Bill and Donna discussed it and decided since they hadn't lived on the West Coast, they'd give it a try for a couple of years. From 2005 to 2007 Bill was the Military Associate Dean of the NPS Graduate School of

International Studies. In 2007 he retired from active military duty and was hired as the Civilian Associate Dean. What he thought would be for a couple of years will be 10 when he fully retires next year. Bill says that after 40 years of service, 30 years active and 10 years civilian, "work is getting in the way of everything else I want to do."

The everything else includes playing golf and tennis, hiking, being active at the First Presbyterian Church of Monterey, and photography. When Bill was a kid he got to use the family Kodak Brownie and has all kinds of family vacation photos from his youth, which he's not in! He took black and

white film classes at community college and has always liked taking photos.

ill used to hike with Sharon **D**Blaziek's husband and she introduced him to PTCC. He joined in March 2012 and shortly thereafter started to help out by making arrangements for the group shoot lunches. When Ken asked for a Program Chair volunteer, Bill agreed to be on a four person committee, but it was difficult to get the committee together, so Bill just ended up doing the job. His two replacements are going to split the duties. Bill credits PTCC with helping him take and make better photographic images. He started out with film, like most of us, and was comfortable in the darkroom. When he got into digital he didn't know what to do about digital post-processing but PTCC rescued him.



Bill has taken classes with Barbara Moon-Batista and Fernando Batista and others, including an iPhoneography class. All the photos Bill shares with us here were taken with his iPhone.

Bill said that at first he liked being a nomad,

but after living in Monterey for eleven years, he's really come to enjoy and appreciate being involved in his community. However, Bill and Donna want to be closer to their daughter, Emily, 33, who lives in Washington, D.C. and to his aging mother, so they're moving east next year. They will spend the summer at their place in Wisconsin and explore from there. Bill says his dream would be to go to the Rhode Island School of Design. He's working on his portfolio.

### **A Points Refresher**

We talk about "Points" all the time and some members may be asking themselves, "What's the Point?" Here's a quick refresher to help explain what all the fuss is about and help everyone understand the terms used and the importance of our Competition Point accounting.

**C**ompetition Points are awarded based on placement in our monthly competitions. For each regular competition, and for overall Field Trip awards, points are earned as follows:

- 4 for each 1st place.
- 3 for each 2nd place.
- 2 for each 3rd place.
- **1** for each HM (and 4th if awarded by judge)

A member's points are counted two ways: as **Year Points** & as **Club Points:** 


#### • Year Points:

Begin at zero with each new Club Year and accumulate throughout that year. They are the basis for the Club's yearly achievement awards.

#### • Club Points:

Begin at zero when you join PTCC and are the basis for your Group progression. They accumulate throughout your active status with the Club until you achieve 50 points. At 50 Club Points, you move into Group A and only your Year Points are counted.

An up-to-date points accounting is available at our website's *Member Resources*. This is updated shortly after each competition's returns.

#### **Tips and Tricks** Pet Photography

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Here's a simple, but informative site about photographing your pets: <u>http://www.</u> <u>exposureguide.com/photographing-pets.htm</u> This article offers six tips to take animal photography up a notch and briefly discusses each one:

- 1. Catch your Pet's Character
- 2. Freeze the Action
- 3. Aim for the Eyes
- 4. Include People
- 5. Get on their Level
- 6. Avoid Using a Flash

The article also mentions recommended settings (using a fast shutter speed and open aperture) and equipment (a telephoto lens for capturing your pet from a distance and a standard lens for good portraits and low light conditions), and practical ideas for working with pets to get better images.

This site has many pointers to other interesting photography subjects as well. Worth a look, and maybe a bookmark!
