## **Shots and Spots**

by Lillie Grossman fter reading Spots for Shots in last month's Bits & Pixels, I found these Red Torch Aloes lining Ocean View Boulevard in Pacific Grove. It was a perfect place to try my new 28 mm lens.

Aloe arborescens is a large, multi-headed, sprawling succulent. Its scientific name indicates it sometimes reaches tree size. A typical height for this species is 6.6 – 9.8 feet. The leaves are armed with small spikes along the edges and have a beautiful cylindrical shape. Its flowers are a vibrant red/orange color. Aloe arborescens is valued by gardeners for its architectural qualities, succulent green leaves, large flowers, and winter blooming. Its sweet nectar attracts birds, butterflies, and bees.



Lab studies published in the *Journal of Ethnopharmacology* show improved healing rates of wounds addressed with the pulp from *Aloe arborescens*. This extract tended to significantly reduce wound severity compared to injuries treated with saline. The study found that the application effectively inhibited bacterial growth of four bacteria during the observation period.





## **My Favorite Shots**



## **Editor's Corner**

he Monterey Peninsula Quilters Guild, of which I'm a member, was invited to submit quilts to the Pacific Grove Museum of Natural History, for their current temporary exhibit, Wildflowers Through a Quilter's Eyes. The quilts were due in early December and I was already frantically trying to finish all the sewing projects I was determined to make for my grand-kids for Christmas, and, I also had to finish the PTCC December-January newsletter!

I knew I wanted to do something with California poppies, so I scanned several old slides of a beautiful poppy bloom I shot in the Santa Ynez Valley decades ago. I put a few of them in Photoshop to make the sizes work and printed them out in black and white. Then I took a piece




of paper about the size I wanted the finished quilt to be and cut the pictures out, arranged them in a collage and taped them down. When I was happy with

that, I put a piece of tracing paper over the print collage

and traced the outlines, which I then transferred

to my fabric. I got the whole thing done in 10 days and it's hanging in the Wildflower exhibit at the
