PTCC members can participate in two ways:
Bring one or more matted prints (any size) to be displayed around the room and/or buy one or more tickets for a chance to take a print home with you. Tickets are \$5 each or 5 for \$20. What a bargain!

Here's how it works: Donated prints are displayed and tickets are sold. Participants' numbers are drawn one at a time. The person holding the first ticket drawn gets the pick of everything on display. Each participant whose ticket is drawn in turn after that gets to pick from the remaining prints. We'll keep it going until all the prints have a new home. Last year we raised \$600 for the Food Bank and had a lot of fun in the process.

He explains how the title directs the viewer to your work or to an important aspect of the photo. 
### **Tips and Tricks**

receive data on the subject, including a photo, a brief description, and genus and species information. I photographed a frog in Wisconsin, uploaded the image to iNaturalist, and learned that it was a Northern Leopard Frog. Easy, peasy!

- Amateur is open to anyone, 18 years of age or older, who consider photography a hobby.
- Advanced Amateur is open to those who do not consider photography a main occupation, but have had their work published, showcased, or have previously won first place on a photograph in the Santa Cruz County Fair.
- Professional is open to those who consider photography one of their main occupations or those who are in the market of selling their photography regardless of its income.

Within the three categories, there were 12 entry classes. Jeff was awarded one 3<sup>rd</sup> Place and two HM ribbons. Chris was awarded two 1<sup>st</sup> Place ribbons, one HM and one Best of Show. Carol was awarded two 1<sup>st</sup> Place ribbons. Congratulations to you three!
