Criteria for our judges to determine an image's Star-Rating

Members compete within three peer groups based on their skills and experience during the previous year.

Color Groups: Red - Green - Blue

A member's **adjusted average STAR RATING** for competitions during the prior Club year determine where that member falls on the distribution curve for all members. At the beginning of a new Club year that distribution is analyzed and new cutoff points are determined. Lower third falls to **RED**, middle third to **GREEN**, and Top third to **BLUE**.

Place Awards: Within each competition Group, our judge awards a 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and HMs as appropriate.
