

Hope you got to ride the Eye!






03-Collingwood, Ontarion Drone Show.jpg

My suggestions are to crop from the right and the top. Also, to darken the sky and then smart sharpen the whole thing.







Perhaps it would be better to backup and take the shot from further away? Maybe like this?






09-Mount Vesuvius towering over the street in Pompeii Italy.jpg



Hope you also got to hear the organ.






14-San Francisco & the Bay from Mount Tamalpais.jpg
