It's an excellent subject, composition, and tone. The issue for me is the underwing of the insect is soft and look like plastic at this distance. I don't know how to get around that except if its sharp enough to see the fuzz or you could catch the wing when it's open. ***

Julie Chen



06 - Haystack Rock in Oregon Mist.jpg Rick Verbanec


I like the framing and the mood. I think it needs more contrast and a better mirror in the water mirror to really make the image stand out. ***

20 - Zebra Duo.jpeg *Julie Chen*




