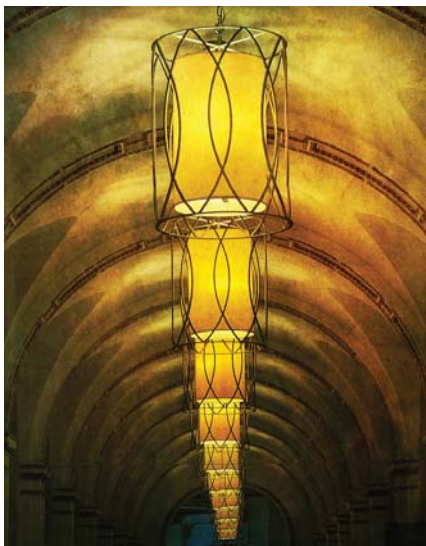

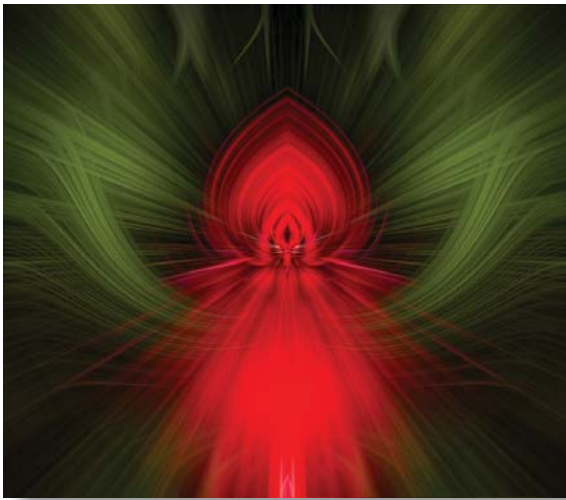


09 - Loreto Bay.jpg

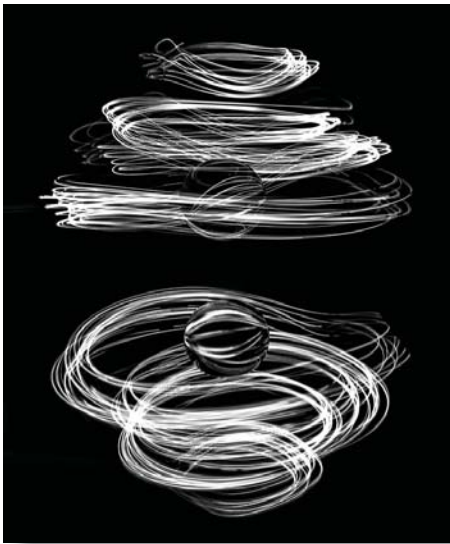

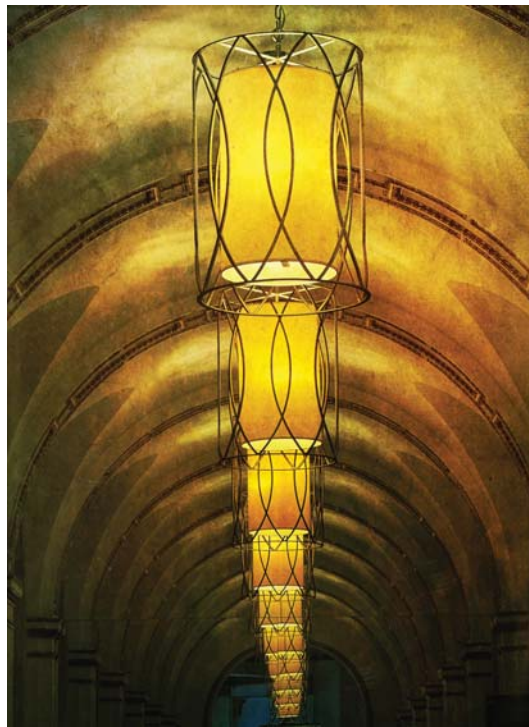
